

Cathedral Active Parishioner Policy

A Registered and Active family/individual is one who:

- Has formally registered and is participating in the life of the parish community for at least 3 months.
- Attends Mass at Cathedral at least 75% of all Sundays.
- Contributes financially to the parish according to ones means.
- Places the offertory envelope each week in the collection basket, even if empty. (If you forgot your envelope there are extra envelopes in the pews and tables at the back of the church.)

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition rate as CCS and BE High School
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirma-
- Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either at Cathedral or in another parish)

Placing your envelope in the Sunday collection basket is an important aspect of parish stewardship. We are not called to make an equal gift but an equal sacrifice in proportion to the blessings given to us by God. The offertory basket carried in procession to the altar symbolizes our shared sacrifice offered to the Lord in thanksgiving. Placing your envelope in the basket, even if you have given electronically, symbolizes our share responsibility to support the Church and our parish and a communal offering of thanks.

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box "I attended Mass and/or gave electronically" on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection basket. All envelopes in the collection basket are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as Inactive and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes please contact Stephanie Stewart at executive.assistant@charlestoncathedral.com.

Sacrament of Marriage: Either bride or groom must be registered at the Cathedral at least 12 months before scheduling a date and beginning the 6 month marriage preparation. 

RECTOR'S CORNER

3rd Sunday of Easter – 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The joy of the great season of Easter continues! Forty days of fast have given way to fifty days of feast. The Season of Easter will continue through Pentecost on May 28.

First Holy Communion is fast approaching! Please keep in your prayers our young men and women, who will soon receive Jesus' Body and Blood for the first time in Holy Communion at the 11:15am Mass on April 30. As they receive Our Lord for their first time, let each of us renew our own excitement for this magnificent gift. Receive *every* Holy Communion as if it is your first... as if it is your last.

I mentioned last week that we would take a look at the promises – the covenant with God – we renewed at our Easter Masses. What exactly have we promised? The expanded form of this renewal begins with this important question: "Do you renounce sin so as to live in the freedom of the children of God?" We answer, "I do." This is freedom verses its opposite – enslavement. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus clearly says, "Truly I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin" (8:34).

Jesus comes to liberate us, to set us free. He destroys the tangled web sin weaves in our lives, like weeds slowly choking out the light of God. The more sin enslaves us, the less clear we think, affecting our words and actions. In our day, freedom often seems to be defined as the ability to do whatever one wishes. "I am free to do whatever I want," and, "Nobody can tell *me* what to do." Yet, we know that having freedom to act or speak a certain way is not always the *right* thing to do. One has freedom to yell "Fire!" in a crowded public building, but there better be a fire if you do it! Freedom is not found in fulfilling every desire or speaking every thought that comes to mind, but instead in living and speaking as the children of God we are.

Sin truly enslaves. We live in the freedom of the children of God when we realize that it is God who has created us, and that He calls us to follow Him. Freedom is found not in doing whatever we please but in using our freedom to choose the right thing – to choose the good.

To live in the freedom of the children of God is a great responsibility because it requires us to remain ever vigilant and ever attentive to our relationship with God. It compels us to be attentive to the needs of others and to our own spiritual needs as well.

Reflecting on this baptismal promise, ask the Lord today for the grace to renounce sin and to choose Him, so you may truly live in the freedom of the children of God.


