

Cathedral Active Parishioner Policy

A Registered and Active family/individual is one who:

- 1. Has formally registered and is participating in the life of the parish community for at least 3 months.
- 2. Attends Mass at Cathedral at least 75% of all Sundays.
- 3. Contributes financially to the parish according to ones means.
- 4. Places the offertory envelope each week in the collection basket, even if empty. (If you forgot your envelope there are extra envelopes in the pews and tables at the back of the church.)

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition rate as CCS and BE High School
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either at Cathedral or in another parish)

Placing your envelope in the Sunday collection basket is an important aspect of parish stewardship. We are not called to make an equal gift but an equal sacrifice in proportion to the blessings given to us by God. The offertory basket carried in procession to the altar symbolizes our shared sacrifice offered to the Lord in thanksgiving. Placing your envelope in the basket, even if you have given electronically, symbolizes our share responsibility to support the Church and our parish and a communal offering of thanks.

If you use electronic transfer to make your offertory contribution and other gifts, simply check the box "I attended Mass and/or gave electronically" on the empty envelope and then drop it in the collection basket. All envelopes in the collection basket are recorded in our parish database.

Once six months elapses without any envelopes or online donations received, the account is marked as Inactive and envelopes are no longer distributed. To begin receiving stewardship envelopes please contact Stephanie Stewart at executive.assistant@charlestoncathedral.com.

Sacrament of Marriage: Either bride or groom must be registered at the Cathedral at least 12 months before scheduling a date and beginning the 6 month marriage preparation. RECTOR'S CORNER

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time -2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Are you familiar with the brown scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel? Let me introduce you! Like medals and crosses that many wear, scapulars are also sacramentals. Other very familiar sacramentals that we use all the time include crucifixes, rosaries, candles, holy water, statues, ashes on Ash Wednesday, palms on Palm Sunday, the sign of the cross, and many more. Sacramentals are not Sacraments, of which there are only seven. They do not confer grace in the way the Sacraments do, but they can prepare us to receive grace and dispose us to cooperate with it. In a word, they work in an everyday way to remind us of the Sacraments and the grace of God that permeates our lives. The fact that they are ubiquitous for Catholics is a reminder of God's omnipresence — that He is always with us.

A scapular consists usually of two small pieces of cloth (often of wool and with holy pictures) connected in a way so that it can be worn over the neck and under our clothing. Historically, it comes from a long piece of cloth originally worn for work by men and women in certain religious Orders. Through the centuries, lay persons, who wanted to be close to these religious Orders and share in some way with that Order's work and prayer, would wear a reduced form of that Order's scapular, which is what we have today. The most popular scapular by far is the brown scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The brown scapular is a silent prayer that shows one's complete consecration and dedication to Jesus Christ through the love, intercession, and example of His mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This commitment finds its origin in Baptism by which we become children of God. In this scapular, we "put on Christ" (see Romans 13:14; Galatians 3:27) with the help of Mary. The scapular is worn every day under one's clothing and stands as a commitment to follow Jesus like Mary, the perfect model of all the disciples of Christ.

This year, the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, July 16, falls on Sunday. Although the liturgy will be from the normal Sunday, we will offer all who would like to be invested with the scapular to come forward when invited at the end of Mass. Scapulars will be provided by our local lay Carmelites. Our Lady said to St. Simon Stock, "Whoever dies invested with this Scapular shall be preserved from the eternal flames. It is a sign of salvation, a sure safeguard in danger, a pledge of peace and of my special protection until the end of the ages." Note that the scapular does not act as a "ticket" to heaven. One who wears the brown scapular pledges to strive to live one's whole life in a manner worthy of heaven. We pray, after all, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."
