

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Wednesday, October 18, the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist. Among other things, St. Luke is the patron saint of physicians, himself having been one. Because of this fun fact, the Bishop will be celebrating the 5:30pm Mass this Saturday, October 21, for all Medical Professionals. May St. Luke help guide all those who work in healthcare that they may look to the Divine Physician, Jesus Christ, bringing healing of body, mind, and spirit.

You may or may not know, but St. Luke wrote *two* books of the Bible – both the Gospel of Luke and Acts of the Apostles. He was also a faithful disciple of St. Paul and a Greek convert to the faith from the ancient city of Antioch. His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D. Luke appears in Acts during St. Paul's second missionary journey. He remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey when he then accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, remaining near him during Paul's imprisonment in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion. It is also clear that Luke was privy to special information from the Blessed Virgin Mary herself, carefully recording her perspective of Jesus' conception, infancy, and childhood.

Luke's Gospel is sometimes called the Gospel of Mercy, since he alone records the parable of the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, and the redemption of the "good thief" while on the cross. We pray for the same mercy of God.

Please note that next week (Monday, October 23, through Thursday, October 26), all the priests of the diocese will be away for our annual priest retreat. This year we are again at the Kanuga Conference Center in Hendersonville, N.C. Because both Fr. Lacombe and I will be away, please note that there will be no confessions or daily Mass these days (Oct. 23-26). Please use this time to pray for more vocations to the priesthood. The call from the Master is not lacking. We just need to help our future priests hear the call and encourage them to follow Him. Men: Aren't you seeking more in your faith? Come join other men from the parish to deepen your faith and knowledge. Beginning Thursday, Oct. 19, we are reviving an early morning men's group. The group will meet for Holy Mass at 7am followed by a meeting until 8am in the Cathedral Center. 8am will be a "hard stop," meaning that we will end no matter what so that some men can get to work. (While the group is for men, the preceding Mass will be open to all.) On days that I cannot offer the Mass, there will be Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours.

Cathedral Active Parishioner Policy

A Registered and Active family/individual is one who:

- 1. Has formally registered and is participating in the life of the parish community for at least 3 months.
- 2. Attends Mass at Cathedral at least 75% of all Sundays.
- 3. Contributes financially to the parish according to ones means.
- 4. Places the offertory envelope each week in the collection basket, even if empty. (If you forgot your envelope there are extra envelopes in the pews and tables at the back of the church.)

Active member status in our database is essential for requesting the following:

- Parishioner tuition rate as CCS and BE High School
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Marriage (for oneself or for one's children, either at Cathedral or in another parish)

Sacrament of Marriage: Either bride or groom must be registered at the Cathedral at least 12 months before scheduling a date and beginning the 6 month marriage preparation. The bride/groom must meet the Active Parishioner Policy requirements. The Wedding Policy Booklet may be found on the Cathedral Website. Baptisms: Parents desiring Baptism of their children must be registered at the Cathedral Parish and meet the Active Parishioner Policy requirements. More information on Baptism, including an online form, may be found on the Cathedral Website. To schedule to have your child baptized, please contact Ms. Cheryl LaRose at secretary@charlestoncathedral.com.
