



Christ the King – 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today, we "crown" our liturgical year with this Solemnity of Jesus Christ the King. Next Sunday, the 1 st Sunday of Advent, begins a new liturgical year – Year B in the Lectionary cycle. During Year B, most of the Sunday Gospels will come from St. Mark. Advent marks the perfect time to make a new spiritual beginning with new spiritual resolutions. Begin with real, dedicated time for prayer. Everything else will flow from that.

As I mentioned in my column last week, Advent is almost upon us. Do not let the world dictate to you what Advent is. Instead, allow yourself to experience Advent as the disciple of Jesus Christ that you are. Experience the season as a time of real, authentic preparation. As such, I again invite you to join St. Mary of the Annunciation parishioner and Yale-trained biblical scholar Betsy Cahill as she offers free daily Advent reflections by email. These brief meditations are accompanied by a prayer and a link to the day's lectionary readings. The reflections begin next Sunday, December 3. We are nearing the close of November, the month we lovingly remember and pray for all our departed loved ones. The names on the envelopes on the altar are being remembered in a special way at each Mass. May they rest in peace. Of course, praying for the faithful departed is a spiritual work of mercy that we can and should do all year long.

Save the date! With joy, we Catholics should do little "save-the-dates" for our Holy Days. These are the feasts and festivals that shape our lives and beliefs and give us deeper insight into *who* we really our – our true identity as a child of God. This is immensely important in times like ours where people seem to chronically suffer from an "identity crisis." Jesus is the remedy, and His Saints and celebrations are ways to give us more grace and peace and meaning.

With that said, mark your calendars for the patronal celebration of the United States – the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8. Holy Masses will be at 8am, 12:05pm, and 7pm. A Holy Day of Obligation means that Catholics are obliged to attend Mass somewhere for the feast. But why say "obligation?" To be "obliged" to do something seems difficult for people in our day. Think of this instead – it really is a matter of perspective. Recall that love means that we *joyfully* fulfill certain obligations in life – things we *must* do. People who are married know this! Couples joyfully live out the obligation to remain faithful to one another. Catholics out of love not only are obliged to participate at Holy Mass all Sundays but also on a very few Holy Days, always out of love for God and neighbor.

May Jesus reign in all our words and actions. Thy Kingdom come! Father Wilson



Cathedral Active Parishioner Guide

How do I know if I am an active part of the Cathedral parish family?

The Cathedral is able to operate only because of the generosity of our "family." A Registered and Active family/individual is one who:

- 1. Has formally registered and is participating in the life of the parish community for a sufficient amount of time.
- 2. Attends Mass at Cathedral at least 75% of all Sundays.
- 3. Contributes financially to the parish according to one's means.
- Places the offertory envelope each week in the collection basket, even if empty. (If you forgot your envelope there are extra envelopes in the pews and tables at the back of the church.)

Active status in our database is essential for consideration of the following:

- Parishioner tuition rate as CCS and BE High School
- Endorsement to serve as a sacramental sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation
- Holy Baptism, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or Holy Matrimony (for oneself or for one's children, either at Cathedral or in another parish)

Sacrament of Holy Matrimony: Congratulations! The world truly needs strong, faithful couples. Our parish stands ready to help prepare you for your life together in Christ through this holy Sacrament. The Diocese of Charleston requires a minimum of 6 months preparation for the Sacrament, so please contact us as soon as you are engaged so that we can share your joy and begin the process of preparation and reserving a date for your special day. Please understand that not all dates and times at the Cathedral may be available. Also, to receive the added benefits of being a Cathedral parishioner, either the bride or groom must be registered for a sufficient time before reserving a date. For help in understanding what it means to have a home here at the parish, please see the Active Parishioner Guide. A comprehensive set of Wedding guidelines may be found on the Cathedral Website. Please contact Mrs. Stephanie Stewart at weddings@charlestoncathedral.com for more information. We look forward to helping you forge a future together!

Holy Baptism: The birth of your child is such a gift! Let the Cathedral parish help you give the gift of new birth through the waters of Holy Baptism. For a child to receive Baptism at the Cathedral, please note that at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, regularly attend Holy Mass, participating in the life of the parish, and be registered at the Cathedral for a sufficient time prior to requesting the date. In this, you become part of our wider parish family! First-time parents must attend our Baptismal Preparation session prior to the Baptism. Please contact Ms. Cheryl LaRose at secretary@charlestoncathedral.com for more information. Additional information on Baptism, including an online form, may be found on the Cathedral Website. Godparents are encouraged to attend a Baptismal Preparation session as well. Since godparents promise to help raise your child in the practice of the Catholic faith, godparents must be practicing Catholics at whatever parish they attend.
