

RECTOR'S CORNER

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time - 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I simply cannot let another week go by without thanking our many "elves," who decorated the Cathedral so magnificently for the Christmas season. Simply put, Wow! Thank you! Many thanks also to Scott Powell and all our musicians, who practice so hard, all for God and you. Thanks to the many ushers, altar servers, staff, and all of our many hard-working volunteers, who help keep us looking great. From the bottom of my heart, thank you all!

We have returned to "Ordinary Time." Despite what the English word sounds like, "ordinary" here does not mean "plain" or "uninteresting." We are a global faith with an equally global language and vocabulary. "Ordinary Time" is a translation of Tempus per Annum, literally meaning "Time (or Season) During the Year." Whereas the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, all have their particular character and turn our attention to more specific mysteries in the life of Christ, Ordinary Time is meant to capture the meaning of Sunday in its fullness as lived throughout the year. After all, every Sunday is literally a "little Easter." This is why we gather on Sunday – the Lord's Day – the day of both the First and the new Creation – the glorious first day of the week on which Our Lord rose and conquered death forever.

The term "Ordinary" also refers to the ordinal numbers (1, 2, 3, 4, etc.), which is why this Sunday is the 2nd Sunday, next is the 3rd Sunday, and so on. We could just as easily call this "Ordered Time" since the Sundays are in sequential order.

The primary color of Ordinary Time is green, a color representing life and growth (think of the leaves on trees). It is also the color associated with hope, which, like growing things, is always new and fresh.

When you awake, instead of turning first to email and social media, why not offer those first moments to God? Perhaps take your smart phone or computer and look up the Mass readings of the day followed by an Our Father. (Or at least read the Gospel.) It takes so little time and can set the tone for the whole day.

Confusion abounds. Wouldn't you appreciate some clear teaching on the faith? I'd like to suggest the Institute of Catholic Culture. While I'm brushing my teeth, shaving, or driving, I like to listen to one of their dozens (possibly hundreds) of free podcasts on the faith. You can download their app or go online to instituteofcatholic culture.org.

The ICC offers online adult Catholic education programs free of charge covering a broad spectrum of topics including theology, philosophy, history, scripture, literature, catechetics, and more. Why exist in confusion? The answers are here if we are humble to accept them. Know the Faith. Love the Faith. Live the Faith.


